Albert W. Collins Dies At Newbern; Funeral Monday

Funeral services for Albert W. Collins, 75, for many years a widely known merchant of Hale County, were held from his home in Newbern at 10:30 o'clock Monday morning, with burial in the Greensboro Cemetery. Mr. Collins died Saturday afternoon. He had been in poor health for two years, and his death was not unexpected.

Born and reared in North Carolina, he had been a resident of this county for many years. He was a merchant in Greensboro for a long while, and then operated a store in Newbern for about 12 years, retiring in 1943 when his health began to fail. Mr. Collins was one of the county's best citizens, and he will be sorely missed.

Surviving him are his widow, Mrs. Margaret Collins of Newbern, and two sisters, Mrs. Emma Taylor of Marion and Mrs. Kate Andrews of Miami, Fla.
